Landscape Photography

If you love the great outdoors, capturing beautiful landscape and wildlife pictures, this class is for you! Here you'll learn about the specialized tools and equipment used to make great landscape photographs. We'll focus on traditional and cutting-edge approaches to landscape photography, and examine historic, technical, and aesthetic aspects of landscape photography through lectures, group discussions, field studies, photographic assignments, and image critiques. You'll learn to use smartphone apps for planning, techniques for capturing star trails and painting with light, using filters and Adobe Photoshop for enhancing images, and much more. A basic knowledge of photography is required (if you don't have basic camera knowledge, enroll in the Digital Photography I class first!). Your instructor, Angela Faris Belt, will guide the class on two optional 4-day weekend travel trips to some spectacular landscapes (locations and dates TBD).

Please note: most image generators require a paid monthly membership for any generations you create beyond a trial period and require a membership to use your images commercially. These memberships are generally priced at about \$30 a month, so bring a Virtual Course method of payment to sign up for one of these if you think you will create more than a few images.



Arapahoe Community College, in collaboration with **Craig Hospital** and **MINDSOURCE - Brain Injury Network** at the Colorado Department of Human Services offers a program for individuals with brain injury. Our program bridges the gap between rehab and return to community and addresses the cognitive, social, emotional and regulatory skills needed to return to work, school, and successful community living.

Targeted Skills Include:

- Life management and self advocacy
- Executive functioning
- Social interaction and communication
- Self-awareness and goal-setting
- Impulse control and emotional regulation


